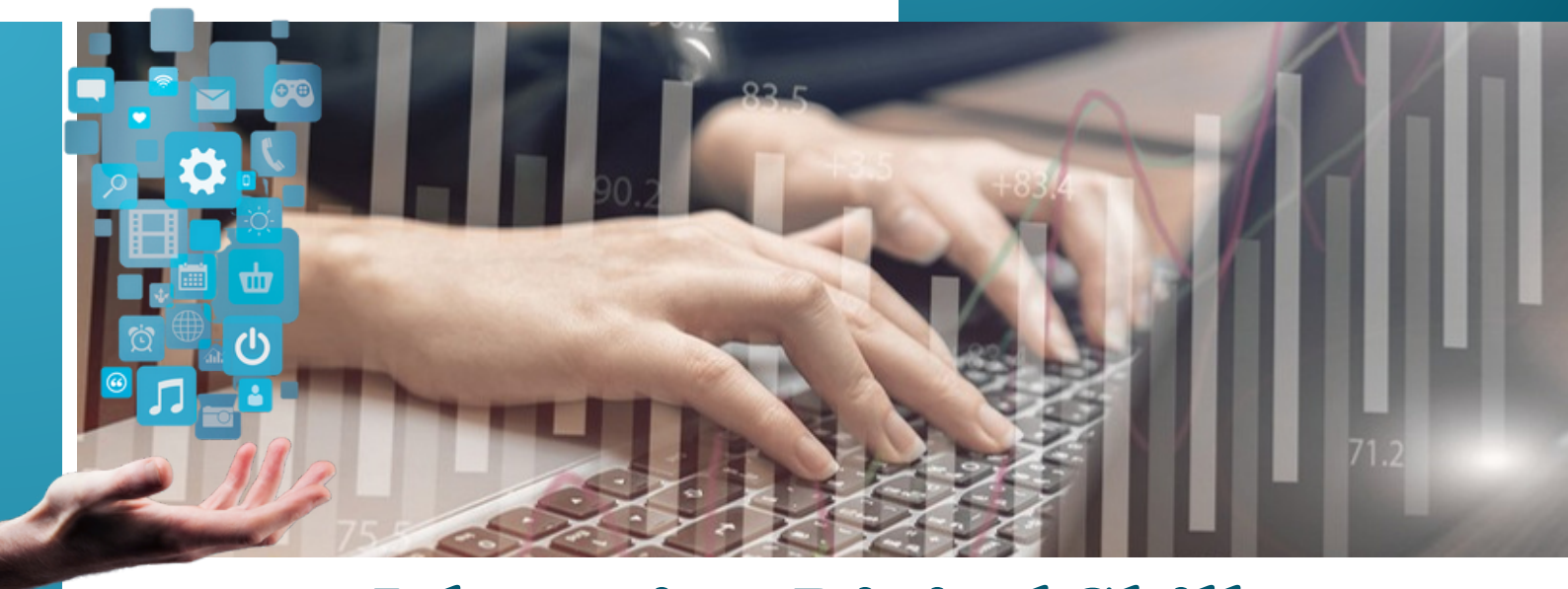




Advancing Digital Skills: from research to training

As the digital landscape continues to evolve, so does the need for a workforce equipped with specialized ICT skills. Over the past months, the CONVERT consortium has been actively transforming research insights into concrete training opportunities designed for recent non-ICT graduates and junior employees. We are excited to share the latest progress in the development of our innovative reskilling programme.

What we have achieved so far:

Thanks to the collaborative efforts of all partners, the following key activities have been successfully completed:

✓ Mapping emerging ICT skills

We conducted an in-depth analysis of current and upcoming ICT skill needs at both national and EU level. This mapping exercise helped us identify the most relevant digital competences required by the labour market.

✓ Development of a set of specialised ICT skills

Building on the research results, we created a specialised ICT skills framework that reflects the expectations of employers and supports learners in accessing emerging job opportunities.

✓ Design of training outline and curriculum

Our team has designed a comprehensive training outline and curriculum structured around the identified skills, ensuring a practical, learner-centred, and labour-market-oriented approach. All training modules—covering the specialised ICT competences—have been developed. The content integrates interactive elements, real-world examples, and clear learning outcomes to support an effective learning experience.

✓ Development of the E-Learning Platform

We have completed the creation of the CONVERT online platform, which will host the full training programme. The platform is designed to be accessible, user-friendly, and suitable for self-paced learning.

What comes next:

We are now preparing to launch the pilot testing of the e-learning platform and the training materials.

During this phase, a selected group of recent graduates and young professionals will navigate the platform, complete the modules, and provide valuable feedback. Their input will help us refine the training content and ensure its relevance, clarity, and usability.

The piloting phase marks a crucial step toward validating the CONVERT programme as an effective pathway for reskilling into ICT roles.

Updates on the piloting activities

As the piloting phase progresses, the CONVERT consortium will closely monitor the implementation of the training modules and the performance of the platform. Key findings, user experiences, and preliminary results will be collected and analysed to further enhance the quality and relevance of the training offer.

We will keep stakeholders, learners, and partners informed throughout this phase by sharing regular updates on the project's communication channels. These updates will highlight major achievements, lessons learned, and next steps as we work toward the finalisation of the CONVERT reskilling programme.
